climate. Instead, WSAA says, we need a mix of strategies, including water efficiency. For

resilience in drought, it's better if new supply is independent of rainfall, such as water recycling or desalination. I couldn't agree more. Extending the dam in an area that will suffer for it and not benefit at all, including access to the water collected is not the way forward.
