

Temporary Water Restrictions Order for the Wianamatta-South Creek Water Source (No. 2) 2026

Explanatory note

This Order is made under section 324(1) of the *Water Management Act 2000*. The object of this Order is to impose temporary water restrictions for the Wianamatta-South Creek Water Source.

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1 Name of Order

This Order is the *Temporary Water Restrictions Order for the Wianamatta-South Creek Water Source (No. 2) 2026*.

2 Commencement

This Order commences on 16 January 2026 and will remain in force until 30 January 2026, unless it is repealed or modified by further order before that date.

3 Temporary water restrictions

The taking of water from those parts of the water source specified in Schedule 1 is prohibited as specified in Schedule 2.

Schedule 1

Water Source

- 1 This Order applies to those watercourses in the Wianamatta-South Creek Water Source from 11 Kurrajong Road North St Marys downstream to the confluence of South Creek with the Hawkesbury River, including the following watercourses:
 - a. The unnamed watercourse which flows from Kurrajong Road North St Marys to South Creek,
 - b. South Creek downstream of its confluence with the above unnamed watercourse to its confluence with the Hawkesbury River.

Schedule 2

Prohibitions on the taking of water

- 1 The taking of water from those watercourses in the Wianamatta-South Creek Water Source as described in Schedule 1 is prohibited.
- 2 The prohibition in paragraph (1) does not apply to the taking of water for remediation, testing or monitoring purposes.
