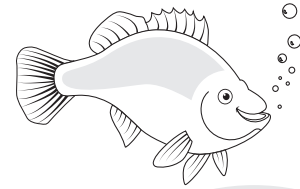


*The Baaka is home

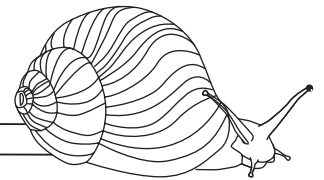
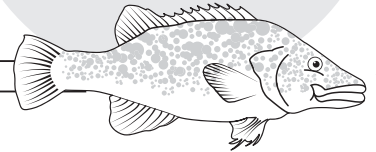

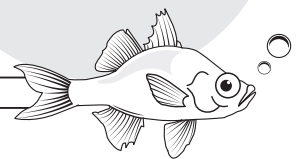
**Murray Cod are

are transparent.**

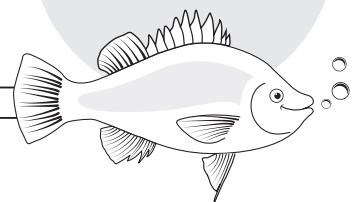
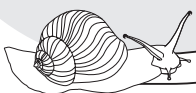


**Olive Perchlets

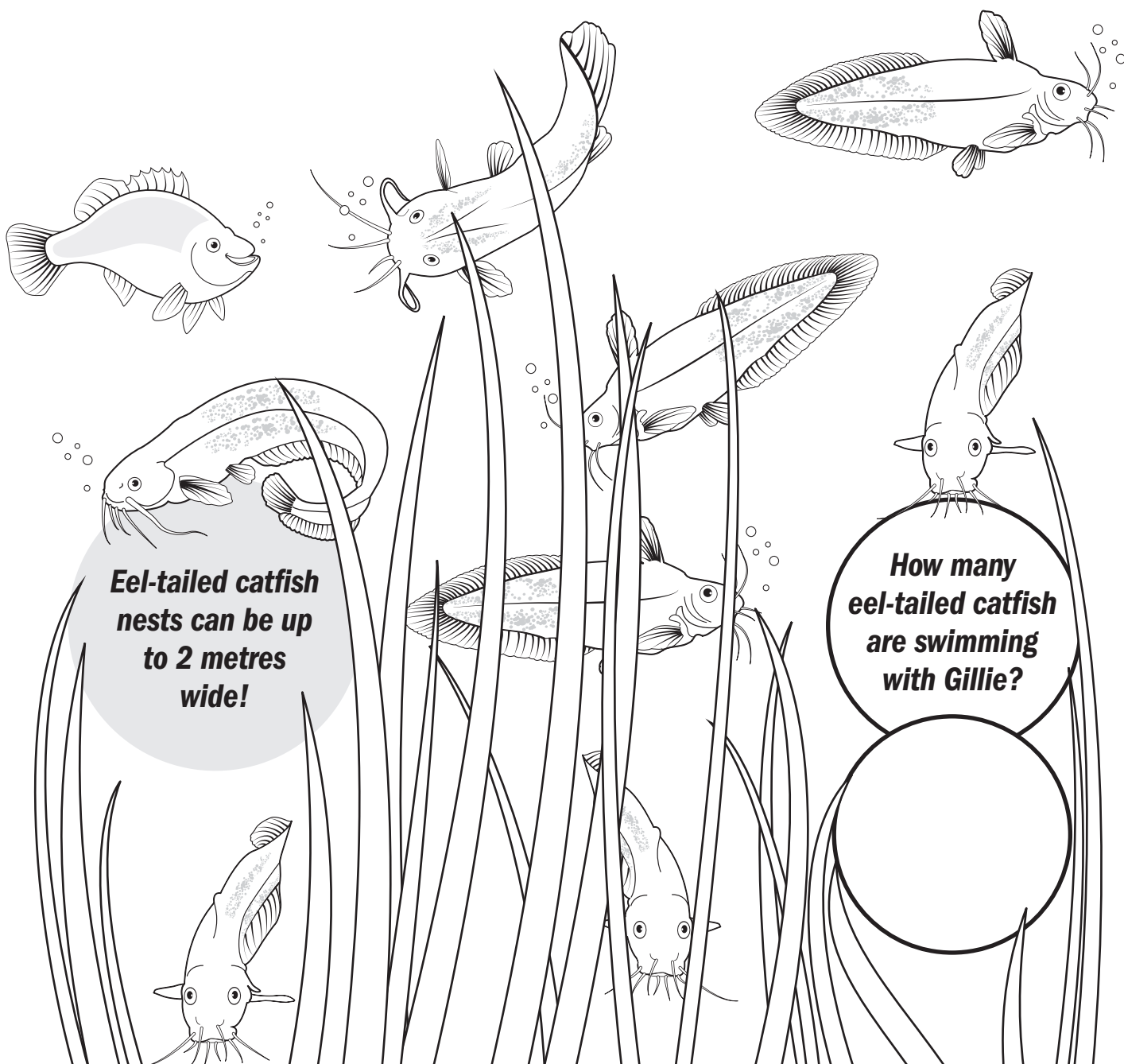

and gravel to build nests for their eggs.



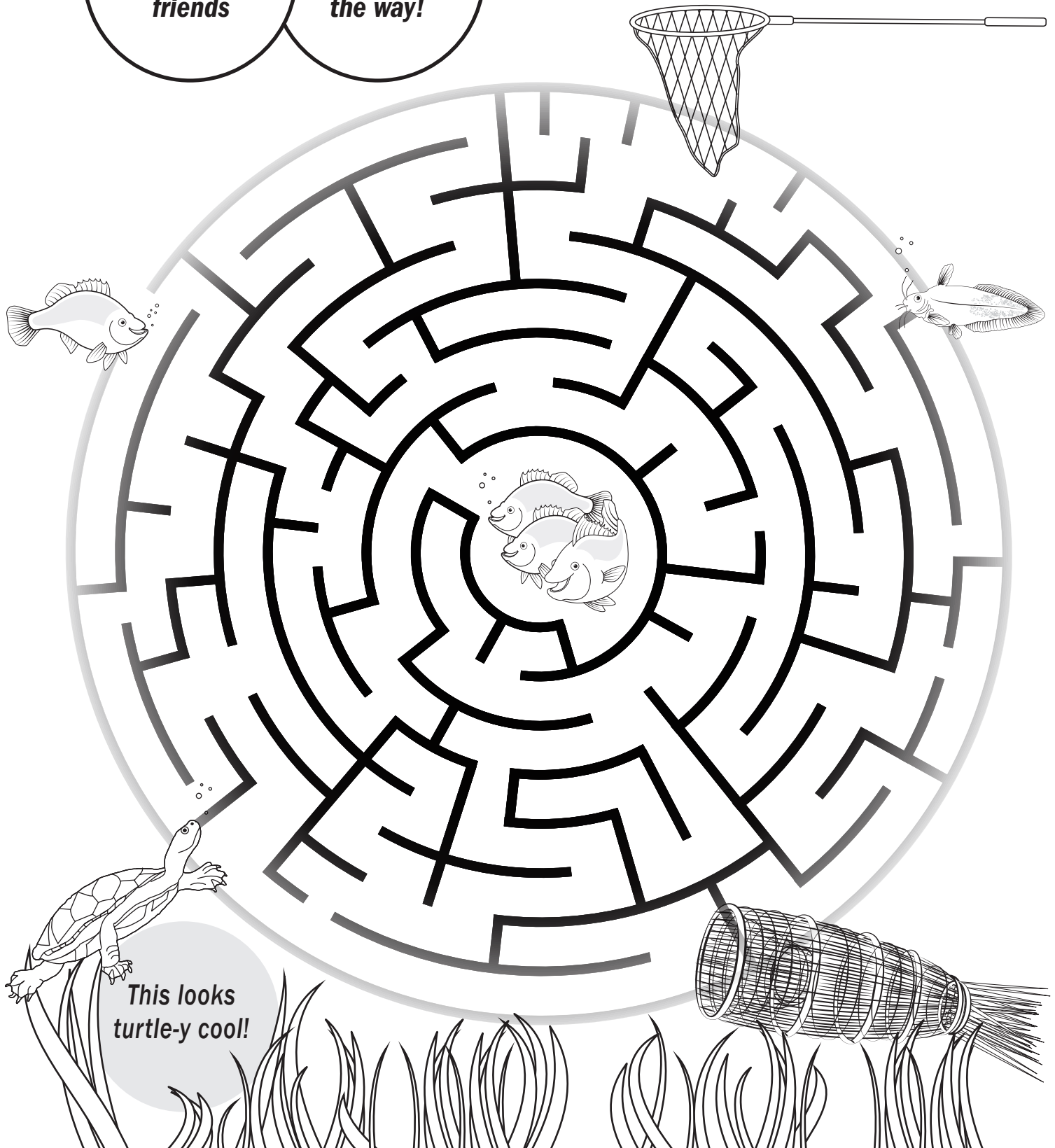

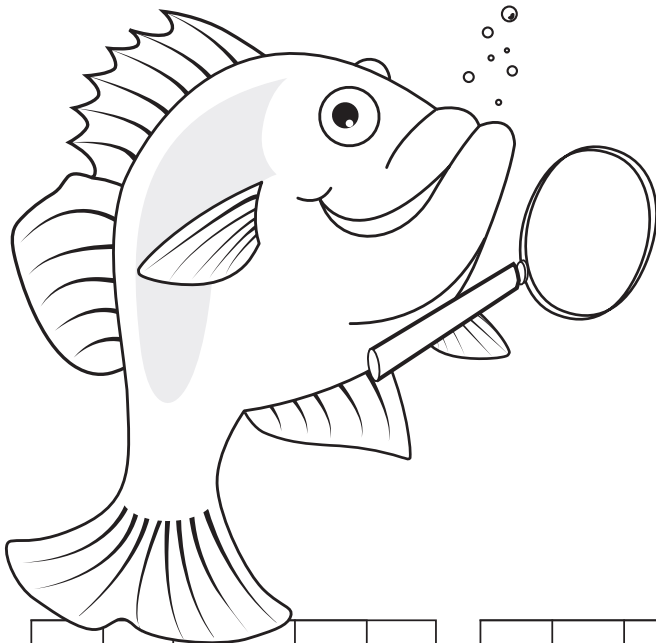
